

on a candidate's ability, history and commitments to create formal legislation and offer official mandates that advance the work to develop community review of police policy and conduct.

This office would organize and maintain a fund for the support of civil law suits against police officers, departments and the respective jurisdictions (federal, state, county, municipality, etc.) where anti-black police conduct has occurred.

Identify and organize unions and union based organizations to both officially and financially support this office and other actions aimed at stopping anti-black police violence.

Have this citizen's/community office work to support the demands made at the national level which include:

We will help develop a network of organizations and advocates to form a national policy specifically aimed at redressing the systemic pattern of anti-black law enforcement violence in the US.

We will also demand, through the network, that the federal government discontinue its supply of military weaponry and equipment to local law enforcement.

We will call on the office of US attorney general Eric Holder to release the names of all officers involved in killing black people within the last five years, both while on patrol and in custody.

We will advocate for a decrease in law-enforcement spending at the local, state and federal levels and a reinvestment of that budgeted money into the black communities most devastated by poverty in order to create jobs, housing and schools. This money should be redirected to those federal departments charged with providing employment, housing and educational services.
